



The T. Jayashree Video Collection

T. Jayashree is an independent filmmaker based in Bangalore. She has written, produced and directed for international television, radio, feature and documentary film. Co-founder of the QAMRA Archival Project at NLSIU, her work has focused on the intersection between Gender, Sexuality, Law and Public health. View her work [here](#).

The material in this collection consists of unedited footage of public and private meetings, protests, community workshops, pride marches, and several in depth interviews with activists, lawyers, petitioners and queer folk. This includes footage from her film, [Many People Many Desires \(2004\)](#), as well as from projects that documented crisis intervention, HIV and global access to affordable medication, and the decriminalisation of homosexuality in India. While documenting the queer movement, the material also gives us a richly textured view of changing urban and technological landscapes.

The material is in multi video formats such as VHS tapes, Mini DV and High Definition video. It consists of roughly 30 TB (over 200 hours of high resolution video footage) of external digital hard disks. The video footage is indexed, translated and transcribed in English.
